'Multiple Thefts from Boats in Titchfield Haven.

But last night was exceptional - about 15 boats were broken into, several outboard motors and many items of electronic equipment were taken. Several boats were damaged and one partially sank. So if you are offered or hear of any used equipment going cheap please let the police know.'



Vannes sailors coming to Fareham!

On 24th June, we will welcome 15 boats from the Brittany port of Vannes into the Hamble. They will be visiting as part of the



twinning of Fareham with Vannes which began 50 years ago. A flotilla of boats has made the journey, either from Vannes or Fareham or Fareham to Vannes, every two years since 2001 - Fareham sailed to Vannes in 2015. This will be the 9th such visit. The French crews - up to 50 are expected - will be hosted by four Fareham sailing clubs: Warsash SC, FSMBC, Port-chester SC and Hill Head SC. The visitors will be escorted into the Hamble by host boats, and will berth on the Harbour Master's pontoons. There will be a reception in Warsash SC, to be attended by the Mayor and Mayoress of Fareham. A programme of activities and visits is being organised.

On Monday 26th June the French Crews will be visiting Fareham Borough Council Offices and then spending the rest of the day at FSMBC. There will be tea and cakes at lunchtime, Lugger sailing, Knotting activities, and musical entertainment by the Creekers as well as a BBQ and Jazz in the evening. Members will be offered tickets for the BBQ for sale closer to the event. Come along and join in with the fun.

Thursday 29th June and possibly Friday morning 30th June will be devoted to the hosting of individual French crews by members of the four Fareham Sailing Clubs. This will involve, possibly, driving them to places of local interest and maybe entertaining in their homes or boats or a local hostelry. If you would like to participate in this aspect of the visit, please get in touch with our club representative, Dee Orme. The visit will conclude with a final dinner on Friday 30th June at Warsash SC.

This is a good opportunity to befriend sailing enthusiasts from our twinned town of Vannes. Do not worry if you have not participated such events before. You may be encouraged to visit Vannes in the future, if not by boat then by car or camper van.

LNTM NO 24/17 PORTSMOUTH SMALL BOAT CHANNEL UPDATE

This is an excerpt from a notice put out by the QHM regarding the latest changes to the small boat channel:

2. Following the widening of the Main Approach Channel, the location of the Small Boat Channel over a somewhat narrower and steeper slope has resulted in a reduced tolerance for small craft straying out of the edge of the channel before they experience shoal depths. For this reason, the route of the channel and traffic management measures have been subtly mended in order to simplify the monitoring of vessel positioning and to reduce the potential for inbound and outbound vessels to force each other in to shallow water or the Main Approach Channel respectively.

3. Remaining approximately 50 metres wide throughout its length, the most significant changes are that all vessels using the Small Boat Channel are to leave 4 Bar Buoy to port, whether heading inbound or outbound, and that north of this point, the channel has been straightened from the route currently shown on new edition Chart 2625. Vessels navigating along the Small Boat Channel should now follow a line that passes from 4 Bar Buoy to approximately 25 metres east of BC outer (as depicted), keeping other passing small craft on their own port side.

4. Vessels approaching or departing the small boat channel to the south, particularly at low water, should follow the line of the port lateral buoys in order to avoid grounding on the SE corner of Hamilton Bank, turning to follow the line of the channel in vicinity of 4 Bar Buoy.
