It's a Goodbye from me, Pam, and a Hello from our new Hon Bar Manager, Victor.



End of Seasons Cruiser race wash-up

Many thanks to all who turned up and contributed to the evening. Items discussed included: -

1. Solent Cruiser racing. This year has seen a disappointing turn out of participants, various ideas were discussed on how to increase turnout. Suggestions included emailing membership a week prior to race and greater use of Facebook. Some thought that a lack of racing rule knowledge was a major contributory factor. Mike Ogle suggested a winter Friday evening, at the Clubhouse, could be used to run an informal slideshow on basic racing rules. Date TBA.

- **3. Harbour Handicaps.** This year we have been trailing a new system that amends handicaps to reflect yachts racing historical performance. The new Handicaps (PBH) reduced the average time gap between contestants from around 8 min to 4 min on corrected time. This has resulted in much closer racing, with a different competitor winning each of the three series in 2017. It was agreed that the club should continue with this system, for harbour races only, with the following recommendation:
 - a. Handicaps should only change after the season's races, rather than at the end of each series.
 - b. New contestants, who have never previously entered club races, should be encouraged to do so by a 20-points handicap bonus, to be applied for their first race series.
 - c. It was noted and approved, that the greater the number of races a yacht has entered, the greater emphasis is placed on their average race handicap, when calculating contestants new PBH.
